**WHEREAS**, on March 3, 2003 the court established by Standing Order No. 03-1 an Electronic Case Filing System and adopted Electronic Case Filing Policies and Procedures to govern the program; and


**WHEREAS**, on October 4, 2004 the court issued Standing Order No. 04-7, which required counsel of record in cases then pending in the United States District Court for the Middle District of Pennsylvania to register as filing users for the court's Electronic Case Filing System and file documents electronically within fourteen days or show cause to the Chief Judge why he or she should not be required to register as filing users and file documents electronically; and

**WHEREAS**, those who have neither responded to Standing Order No 04-7 nor requested an extension of time in which to do so are impairing the effective administration of the court's business and demonstrating a disregard for the authority of this court; and

**WHEREAS**, the records of the Clerk demonstrate that you have neither responded to said Order nor requested an extension of time in which to do so;

**NOW, THIS 2nd DAY OF FEBRUARY, 2005, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:**

Within twenty (20) days of the date of this Order, counsel who failed to respond to Standing Order 04-7 shall register as filing users for the court's Electronic Case Filing System and file documents electronically or show cause to the Chief Judge in writing why they should not be required to file documents through the Court's electronic case filing system.<sup>1</sup> Failure to reply to this Order may result in commencement of contempt of court and/or disciplinary proceedings that could result in suspension of the right to practice in this Court in accordance with Local Rule of Court 83.3.1.
