STANDING ORDER

WHEREAS before the Court is the application and request by Robert B. Dunham on behalf of the Death Penalty Information Center (DPIC) for exemption from the fees imposed by the Electronic Public Access fee schedule adopted by the Judicial Conference of the United States Courts;

WHEREAS the Court finds that the DPIC is a non-profit educational organization and falls within the class of users listed in the fee schedule as being eligible for a fee exemption;

WHEREAS the DPIC has demonstrated that an exemption is necessary in order to avoid unreasonable burdens and to promote public access to information;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT the DPIC shall be exempt from the payment of fees for access via PACER to the electronic case files maintained in this court, to the extent such use is incurred in the course of researching capital-habeas cases (code 535);

IT IS ALSO ORDERED THAT the DPIC shall not be exempt from the payment of fees incurred in connection with other uses of the PACER system in this court. Additionally, the following limitations apply:

- I. this fee exemption applies only to DPIC, PACER (Account No. 4616580) and is valid only for the purposes stated above;
- II. this fee exemption applies only to the electronic case files of this court that are available through the PACER system;
- III. by accepting this exemption, DPIC agrees not to sell for profit any data obtained as a result of receiving this exemption;
- IV. the DPIC is prohibited from transferring any data obtained as a result of receiving this exemption, including redistribution via internet-based databases;
- V. this exemption is valid until 12 months form the date of this Order.

This exemption may be revoked at the discretion of the Court at any time. A copy of this Order shall be sent to the PACER Service Center.
