## STANDING ORDER

:

**WHEREAS** before the Court is the application and request by Brent Johnson for exemption from the fees imposed by the Electronic Public Access fee schedule adopted by the Judicial Conference of the United States Courts;

WHEREAS the Court finds that Brent Johnson, as an individual researcher associated with Widener University Commonwealth School of Law, falls within the class of users listed in the fee schedule as being eligible for a fee exemption;

WHEREAS Brent Johnson has demonstrated that an exemption is necessary in order to avoid unreasonable burdens and to promote public access to information;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT Brent Johnson shall be exempt from the payment of fees for access via PACER to the electronic case files maintained in this court, to the extent such use is incurred in the course of helping a professor with her immigration case research for a forthcoming scholarly article she is working on;

IT IS ALSO ORDERED THAT Brent Johnson shall not be exempt from the payment of fees incurred in connection with other uses of the PACER system in this court. Additionally, the following limitations apply:

- 1. this fee exemption applies only to Brent Johnson and is valid only for the purposes stated above;
- 2. this fee exemption applies only to the electronic case files of this court that are available through the PACER system;
- 3. by accepting this exemption, Brent Johnson agrees not to sell for profit any data obtained as a result of receiving this exemption;
- 4. Brent Johnson is prohibited from transferring any data obtained as a result of receiving this exemption, including redistribution via Internet based databases:
- 5. this exemption is valid until July 31, 2021.

This exemption may be revoked at the discretion of the Court at any time. A copy of this Order shall be sent to the PACER Service Center.
