**STANDING ORDER**

**WHEREAS** before the Court is the application and request by Hallam Tuck for exemption from the fees imposed by the Electronic Public Access fee schedule adopted by the Judicial Conference of the United States Courts;

**WHEREAS** the Court finds that Hallam Tuck, a PhD research student at the Centre for Criminology at the University of Oxford's Faculty of Law, falls within the class of users listed in the fee schedule as being eligible for a fee exemption;

**WHEREAS** Hallam Tuck has demonstrated that an exemption is necessary in order to avoid unreasonable burdens and to promote public access to information;

**IT IS HEREBY ORDERED** that Hallam Tuck shall be exempt from the payment of fees for access via PACER to the electronic case files maintained in this court, to the extent such use is incurred to examine prisoner litigation filed by men in contract prison custody within the US Federal Bureau of Prisons;

**IT IS ALSO ORDERED** that Hallam Tuck shall not be exempt from the payment of fees incurred in connection with other uses of the PACER system in this court. Additionally, the following limitations apply:

1. this fee exemption applies only to Hallam Tuck (PACER Account # 5569556) and is valid only for the purposes stated above;
2. this fee exemption applies only to the electronic case files of this court that are available through the PACER system;
3. by accepting this exemption, Hallam Tuck agrees not to sell for profit any data obtained as a result of receiving this exemption;
4. Hallam Tuck is prohibited from transferring any data obtained as a result of receiving this exemption, including redistribution via Internet based databases;
5. this exemption is valid until January 1, 2024.

This exemption may be revoked at the discretion of the Court at any time. A copy of this Order shall be sent to the PACER Service Center.
