## **STANDING ORDER**

**WHEREAS** before the Court is the application and request by Kenta Tsuda for exemption from the fees imposed by the Electronic Public Access fee schedule adopted by the Judicial Conference of the United States Courts;

**WHEREAS** the Court finds that Kenta Tsuda, a graduate research student at the University College London's Faculty of Laws, falls within the class of users listed in the fee schedule as being eligible for a fee exemption;

**WHEREAS** Kenta Tsuda has demonstrated that an exemption is necessary in order to avoid unreasonable burdens and to promote public access to information;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Kenta Tsuda shall be exempt from the payment of fees for access via PACER to the electronic case files maintained in this court, to the extent such use is incurred to research the development of the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA, 42 U.S.C. §§ 4321 et seq) regime in the United States;

**IT IS ALSO ORDERED** that Kenta Tsuda shall not be exempt from the payment of fees incurred in connection with other uses of the PACER system in this court. Additionally, the following limitations apply:

- 1. this fee exemption applies only to Kenta Tsuda (PACER Account # 7142205) and is valid only for the purposes stated above;
- 2. this fee exemption applies only to the electronic case files of this court that are available through the PACER system;
- 3. by accepting this exemption, Kenta Tsuda agrees not to sell for profit any data obtained as a result of receiving this exemption;
- 4. Kenta Tsuda is prohibited from transferring any data obtained as a result of receiving this exemption, including redistribution via Internet based databases;
- 5. this exemption is valid until July 31, 2024.

This exemption may be revoked at the discretion of the Court at any time. A copy of this Order shall be sent to the PACER Service Center.
