STANDING ORDER

WHEREAS before the Court is the application and request by Thien Dong for exemption from the fees imposed by the Electronic Public Access fee schedule adopted by the Judicial Conference of the United States Courts;

WHEREAS the Court finds that Thien Dong, a PhD candidate at the Georgia Institute of Technology, falls within the class of users listed in the fee schedule as being eligible for a fee exemption;

WHEREAS Thien Dong has demonstrated that an exemption is necessary in order to avoid unreasonable burdens and to promote public access to information;


IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Thien Dong shall be exempt from the payment of fees for access via PACER to the electronic case files maintained in this court, to the extent such use is incurred to research the effect of corporate lawsuits (between start-ups and incorporated firms) on the direction and intensity of the defendant's corporate venturing investment activities in the future;

IT IS ALSO ORDERED that Thien Dong shall not be exempt from the payment of fees incurred in connection with other uses of the PACER system in this court. Additionally, the following limitations apply:

1. this fee exemption applies only to Thien Dong (PACER Account # 7108128) and is valid only for the purposes stated above;
2. this fee exemption applies only to the electronic case files of this court that are available through the PACER system;
3. by accepting this exemption, Thien Dong agrees not to sell for profit any data obtained as a result of receiving this exemption;
4. Thien Dong is prohibited from transferring any data obtained as a result of receiving this exemption, including redistribution via Internet based databases;
5. this exemption is valid until May 31, 2023.

This exemption may be revoked at the discretion of the Court at any time. A copy of this Order shall be sent to the PACER Service Center.
